Covid-19 Safety Protocols

Upon arrival at Raue Center for the Arts, all staff, cast, crew, and volunteers will be screened with a series of questions pertaining to COVID-19 symptoms as well as a physical temperature screening. **All staff, cast, crew, and volunteers must wear a face covering when within any Raue Center for the Arts facility and will be required to be vaccinated or provide a negative COVID-19 test.**

If you become sick with COVID-19 symptoms, test positive for COVID-19, or have been exposed to someone with symptoms or someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19, please do not come to the rehearsal space, performance, or event.

If you have symptoms of COVID-19, a positive test for COVID-19, or were exposed to someone with COVID-19 within the last 14 days, please report to Raue Center for the Arts operations staff (administration@rauecenter.org).

COVID-19 FACILITY EXPOSURE PROTOCOL

In accordance with the state and local laws and regulations, Raue Center will notify health officials, staff, and families if a person with COVID-19 was present at a rehearsal, performance, or event while maintaining the individual's confidentiality in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

Raue Center for the Arts will notify individuals of closures and restrictions put in place due to COVID-19 exposure. Any areas affected by a COVID-19 exposure will be closed off for a minimum of 24 hours. Following the 24 hours, any exposed areas will be cleaned and disinfected by Raue Center for the Arts. All Raue Center for the Arts' facilities are routinely cleaned and disinfected.

ADDITIONAL COVID-19 PROCEDURES

During an event, rehearsal, or performance, a Raue Center on-duty staff member will be assigned to be responsible for responding to COVID-19 concerns. To limit contact between staff and attendees, all individuals must maintain 6 feet of distance, regardless of vaccination status.

- Signage informing all staff, talent, and patrons that they should: avoid entering the facility if they have a cough or fever or are without a mask; maintain a minimum six-foot distance from one another; and not shake hands or engage in any unnecessary physical contact are marked at each public entrance.
- Signage informing all customers of the Social Distancing Protocol is posted at each public entrance.
- All employees are told not to come to work if sick.
- During the performance, all employees/volunteers are required to wear PPE for the duration. These items are made available by Raue Center for the Arts.
- Employees are assigned to disinfect surfaces regularly.
- Hand sanitizer, soap, and water, or effective disinfectants are available to the public.
